## **EXECUTIVE ORDER No. 20-09**

## **CORONAVIRUS – RELIEF FOR RESTAURANT & BAR OPERATIONS**

WHEREAS, in keeping with federal guidelines, the State of Nebraska has issued guidance throughout the State and has issued a Directed Health Measure applicable in Douglas, Sarpy, Cass, Washington, Lancaster, Saunders and Dodge Counties to limit gatherings to 10 people or less to combat the spread of COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, restaurants and bars across Nebraska are closing their dining areas and need flexibility to innovate by moving takeout service, delivery, and/or curbside service; and

**WHEREAS**, restaurants and bars will continue to serve Nebraskans throughout the pandemic by altering their customary operations in order to provide takeout, delivery, curbside and drive-thru service options.

**NOW THEREFORE,** I, Pete Ricketts, Governor of the State of Nebraska, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and laws of Nebraska, find these conditions merit the granting of a waiver of certain provisions of the Nebraska Liquor Control Act.

Pursuant to this declaration, Executive Order No. 20-06 is hereby amended, and I order the Liquor Control Commission to implement the following temporary change to provide relief to Nebraska restaurant and bar operations:

1. The provisions of Neb. Rev. Stat. §53-124 (6) (a) (iii) which mandate that alcoholic liquor be sold in original package only are waived. This change will allow pre-made cocktails and other alcoholic beverages to be sold so long as the containers are sealed with a lid or other method of securing the product, and not partially consumed.
